Men's Prep Team Comes in at No. 2 in Preseason National Rankings

Perennial prep basketball powerhouse, Putnam Science Academy comes in as the #2 ranked team in the country for the upcoming 2025-26 prep basketball season.

It was a banner year for the program, which set a record with 41 wins, winning 33 consecutive games after suffering two early losses. The season culminated with the program winning its 5th national championship-its 5th in seven years.
